A Note from Steve:

As we begin a new year it is a great opportunity to make changes and try to improve. Part of that process was the survey we sent out last November. We received a good response and some good ideas. I can summarize the surveys with the following statements:

- 1. Members appreciate the value of our club and feel it is our strongest attribute. Members also felt we should focus on this point in advertising.
- 2. Members were not as aware, as we believed, with regards to improvements, events and challenges at the club.
- 3. The biggest areas of interest by the members were the acoustics in the banquet room, the carpet in the banquet room, improving the fairways, and improving sand traps. We found this interesting because through the year the biggest point of contention was the treatment of the native grasses. While it was mentioned, it was only by a few people and was split 50/50 on like or don't like.
- 4. We had many mentions through the survey, in many ways that we needed to advertise and promote that we have the friendliest membership and staff in the area.

In discussions with Brett, Connie and Board Members we have made a few changes and promises to ourselves for 2014. These are all focused on promoting the friendly/relaxed nature of the club. The importance of placing focus on the value our club provides. We will get back to being more aggressive with our fairways and continue the work that was started on our bunkers. The Board, the Ladies Association, and a few members have started to look into the flooring and acoustics issues in the clubhouse. While we do not have much funding for this project, we are all aware that we need a plan first.

Another focus will be to improve our communication to the members. The use of Facebook has been a big asset to the club, but not great for members who are not on Facebook. We also did not send out our normal number of newsletters and emails last summer. We want to improve this year. We will have a Monthly Newsletter.
